Native Americans:

- 1924: Natives are considered citizens by supreme court ruling
 - Indian termination Policy
 - Assimilation of native Americans in to larger US society → getting rid of the tribes
 - Indian relocation Act of 1956:
 - Incurejd Native americans living in or near Indian reservations to relocate to urban areas for greater employment opportunities

African Americans

- Politically active during the revolutionary period
- Black loyalists: fought for the British during the American Revolutionary War
 - Many northern states abolished slavery after the war.

Women

- National Women's Party Leading voice for National Women's Suffrage
 - Early 20'th century
 - White anglo-saxen protenstants
 - o 1919: right to vote
